Upcoming Making Places: What materials can we use to make a painting?

November 5: Reflective Materials

Rebecca Brewer paints ground Mica onto fabric and stretches the fabric over a wooden panel. Can you see how the surface glimmers? Use materials that catch the light in different ways and bold florescent colours to create a painting inspired by Rebecca's work.

November 12: Space as a Canvas

Jessica Groome's work responds to the architecture of the Gallery. She calls her cut outs 'Blinkers.' Using simple shapes as well as positive and negative space she transforms the room. How can you transform a space into a painting and a painting into a space?

November 19: Painting With Tape

Can you find an artist in the Gallery that uses tape in their painting? Arrange tape into a composition, thinking about balance, shape and line. Create a painting with a masking process.

November 25 & 26 Family FUSE Weekend: The Action of Expression

Join us from 10-5pm for interactive performances, workshops, and hands on making experiments as we think about what it means to use Gesture to express ideas.

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
